In addition, we provide extensive training and certification programs for elected officials and staff across the state.

What is the role of the Municipal Management Consultant at MTAS?

The municipal management consultants are usually a city’s first contact with MTAS. These professionals work one-on-one with city officials to find solutions to the complex problems that local governments across the state face every day. Each management consultant provides professional advice and assistance to an assigned set of cities in Tennessee, regardless of size, on a broad range of issues and problems. In addition to providing direct client assistance, our management consultants produce reports on timely and critical issues, teach courses in our statewide training program, and assist other consultants in the agency with individual and team projects.
