I had back surgery by one of the best surgeons in town. He and many others had asked me the usual questions. I told the doctor and hospital I was severely allergic to Vicodin, a common pain control medicine. My allergy was on my chart. When my surgeon came to discharge me, he went through all the questions and instructions then handed me my prescriptions. I carefully looked at them but gave him back one and said "not this one." I told him about my

allergy. He said, "I should have known that and I'm glad you caught it."

He is a great doctor. But the hospital is a busy place and it's easy to see how some things can slip through the cracks. Any of us can make a mistake. We have a lot to gain by double checking things. If something goes wrong or is not right, I have the most to lose. I'd rather have everything go right and have us all succeed.

You have the right to receive quality care. Good healthcare means getting the right care for you and working with your doctor so that you understand all test results and treatment options. This prevents errors from occurring that could be costly. Remember, good healthcare is in your hands!

2 True or False: Americans receive recommended care only 55% of the time.

Answer: True

According to a national study performed by the RAND Corporation, Americans frequently do not receive the care they need. The study found that people in all parts of the country are at risk for receiving poor healthcare; only 55% get recommended care. Not very good news, considering the United States spends more on healthcare than any other industrialized country.

Out of pocket healthcare costs are growing, both for you and your employer. With rising medical costs come higher insurance premiums and co-pays. Rising costs are making healthcare unaffordable for everyone. In fact, approximately 30 percent of all healthcare spending is the result of poor-quality care. Getting the right care at the right time is critical to saving lives and money.

4 Which of the following causes more deaths in the U.S. each year?

- A. Breast cancer
- B. Motor vehicle accidents
- C. AIDS
- D. Medical errors

Answer: D - medical errors

You may be surprised to learn medical errors claim more lives than breast cancer. Medical errors include everything from getting the wrong dose of medication to getting the wrong diagnosis. 98,000 patients die as a result of medical errors in hospitals each year. Consumers have the power to help doctors and hospitals prevent medical errors by asking questions and sharing health concerns.

5 True or False: Hospitals that publicly report the results of the care they provide have better performance results.

Answer: True

Public reports, such as this Consumer Guide, create a powerful incentive for hospitals to improve their standards of quality care. In fact, researchers at the Joint Commission for Accreditation of Hospitals found that hospitals that are required to report on their performance show a significant improvement in performance results.

SAFE Surfing

Finding Health and Quality Information on the Web

When Susan Olsen needed knee surgery for a volleyball injury, she used a website provided by her insurance company to learn more about the hospitals in her area. She learned how often the procedure she needed was performed and the complication rates after surgery. This information helped her make an informed decision about where to seek high quality care.

As healthcare costs continue to rise, many people are expanding their use of consumer websites to assist them in their search for good healthcare. But, how can you tell if the health website you're using is giving you the right information?

- **Learn more about the site.** Information provided on the site should compliment your doctor's recommendation— not replace it. Beware of sites that claim "miracle cures."
- **Check the Source.** Look for links such as "About This Site" or "Contact Us" to help you determine if the website uses a credible source and contains updated information.



- **Keep it Confidential.** Check the site's privacy policy to see how your personal information may be used.
- **Is the Site Accredited?** Health on the Net and URAC provide accreditation to health websites. Look for their seal of approval to determine the accuracy of a website.

When looking for a new car, we compare cost and safety before buying. But, where can you turn to for a comparison of hospital care? 

Understanding the Terms



Computer Physician Order Entry (C.P.O.E.): With C.P.O.E. systems, hospital staff enter medication orders via computers linked to prescribing error prevention software. C.P.O.E. has been shown to reduce serious prescribing errors in hospitals by more than 50%.

Heart Attack Care: A heart attack happens when an artery is blocked and blood supply cannot move through the artery to the heart. This score assesses the overall quality of care given to heart attack patients.

Heart Failure Care: Heart failure is a weakening of the heart so it cannot pump enough of the oxygen and nutrients the body needs. This score assesses the overall quality of care provided to heart failure patients.

ICU Physician Staffing (IPS): Staffing ICUs with doctors who have special training in critical care medicine, called "intensivists," has been shown to reduce the risk of patients dying in the ICU by more than 10%.

National Quality Improvement Goal: Joint Commission's standardized treatment recommendations that accredited healthcare organizations are expected to follow.

Pneumonia Care: Pneumonia can be a very serious infection for patients in the hospital. This score assesses the overall quality of care provided to pneumonia patients, including if the patient received appropriate medication and tests at the right time to prevent complications.

Safe Practices Score: A rolled-up partial credit score of the 27 NQF safe practices that are known to reduce medical errors.
